MEDVEDNICA NATURE PARK



Medvednica Nature Park was founded in 1981 by the Croatian parliament, and Public Institution Nature Park Medvednica manages the Park.

Basic phenomena are **well preserved natural forests and forest communities,** covering 81% of the total Park area.

The Park spreads over the area of the City of Zagreb, Zagreb's and Krapinsko-zagorska districts, the area of 17 938 ha.

It is also a NATURA 2000 protected area (HR2000583 Medvednica).

More than 1 000 000 people visit the Park annually.

The Park has exceptional ecological meaning for Zagreb and is a huge forest and recreational area.

Traditionally citizens of Zagreb visit Medvednica, especially on weekends.
















Forest trail Bliznec is the first educational trail in Croatia, completely, in construction and content, **adapted to persons with disabilities**.

Background information and partners

- The trail begins at the main Park entrance, at parking lot Bliznec, and continues along the Bliznec stream.
- Includes Info point, parking space, the trail and a restaurant.
- Co-founders and partners on Forest trail Bliznec project apart from Public Institution Nature Park Medvednica were: City of Zagreb; Hrvatske šume (Croatian Forests) Ltd. and telecommunication company VIP (today A1).
- The trail was completed in cooperation with Croatian Alliance of Physically Disabled Persons Association.





















Accessibility

- The trail is **800 m long**, it overrides the stream on several points and partly goes above the stream itself.
- Seven bridges are made out of Medvednica oak and constructed in a traditional way, typical for this area.
- The pavement is made out of **concrete panels in contrast color** with an elevated curb stone.
- As an additional safety measure, the wooden fence is built along the whole length of the trail with special reinforcements along the bridges.



















Accessibility

- There are several resting places along the trail. Resting places are parts of double width, and their function is enabling passing by of the wheelchairs and movement along the trail in both directions.
- Each resting position is furnished with benches and information tables in Croatian and English. Information tables are adapted in accordance with the special purpose of the trail. They are in lower position, ensuring easy reading from the wheelchairs, and next to them are wooden books with the same texts written in Braille alphabet.
- The trail can be crossed by all-electric and non-motorized wheelchairs, as well as by visitors with canes and walkers. It can be easily accessed by car on several points, thus permitting easy intervention in case of emergency.























Accessibility

- The trail has lights along the path so it can be visited at night as well.
- In time, the educational trail got another attraction, the way of the Cross, along with texts in Braille alphabet.
- The trail ends at Bliznec sawmill, a restaurant with facilities for persons with disabilities.
- Additional attractions of the Trail are strong sounds of the stream, the nearby waterfall, rustle of the leaves, bird songs, as well as the smell of mushrooms, cyclamen, elder and other flowers, bushes and trees.
- The Forest trail Bliznec allows **physically challenged individuals** to have the same experience as others, **enjoying the Nature Park Medvednica**.



















Actions and achievements

- Forest trail Biznec is planned and constructed as a trail for persons with disabilities, but it welcomes everyone.
 The trail is frequently visited by persons with various disabilities but also by families with small children and elderly people.
- The Easter pilgrimage is held on the trail every year, with a large number of participants, many of them being
 persons with disabilities.
- Public Institution Nature Park Medvednica developed the **interpretative walking program** along the trail for kindergarten and school children.
- Different corporations often come for their corporative volunteering and help to maintain the trail.
- The first **Open Days** were organised on Forest trail Bliznec in 2019. The theme was Accessibility and Inclusion for all visitors of protected areas.
- The value of Forest trail Bliznec is recognized by the wide Croatian public, and in 2002, Public Institution received an award from the Ministry of Environment Protection, Physical Planning and Construction for achievements in the area of environment protection.

Shortcomings

- legal ownership of the land on which the trail was constructed,
- financing all stages of the construction as well as funding the maintenance of the trail once it was finished,
- vandalism and damaging of the infrastructure on the trail,
- natural hazards (storms, flood...).

Lessons learned

- choose the location that meets the needs of persons with disabilities,
- plan well construction and maintenance financing,
- keep the construction simple and safe,
- collaborate with different associations for persons with disabilities,
- consider natural hazards and vandalism.

Benefits

- the trail has inspired others in Croatia to create similar ones,
- it has drawn other visitors to come and walk the trail (other than persons with disabilities),
- it helped raise conscience and awareness of needs and difficulties that persons with disabilities experience,
- it is transferable and a good practice example for others to follow, we will gladly share our experience.

Forest trail Bliznec will celebrate its 20th birthday in 2022!
