Key findings

- International tourism recovered 84% of pre-pandemic levels in January-July 2023 (-16% versus same months of 2019).
- 700 million tourists travelled internationally in the first seven months, +43% over 2022.
- The Middle East saw the best results, with arrivals exceeding by 20% pre-pandemic levels.
- Africa recovered 92% of pre-pandemic visitors in January-July 2023, Europe 91%, the Americas 87% and Asia and the Pacific 61%.
- Revised data puts international tourism receipts at 74% of pre-pandemic values in 2022 (-26% vs 2019).
- UNWTO Confidence Index shows good prospects for September-December 2023 (126), though below experts' evaluation of May-August (132).
- International arrivals on track to reach 80% to 95% of pre-pandemic levels in 2023, with continued pent-up demand and few remaining travel restrictions, though economic conditions remain a challenge.






Percentage of 2019 levels recovered in Jan-Jul 2023 (%)*








Best performing destinations in terms of receipts:






















